Taylor Pond - Life Beneath the Surface

May 10th (Sat.) 4:30–6:00 pm in the Fenton Ruby Park

What the heck is an amphipod? How about a copepod? What are mayfly, damsel fly and dragonfly nymphs? Curious? Then accept this invitation to discover life under the surface of our ponds with biologist Kirsten Martin as she surveys the health of the pond, based on the inhabitants that live there.



Participants will have the opportunity to get their feet wet (if they choose) while learning about the abundant life beneath the surface. We will look at all aspects of the pond, the impacts of surrounding vegetation, wetland soils, emergent and submerged vegetation, and survival strategies among the pond's smallest inhabitants, the macro invertebrates.

This event takes place on Saturday, May 10th, in the Fenton Ruby Park at the corner of Moose Meadow and Burma Roads in Willington.
