A winter hike in the Fenton Ruby Park may never be the same after you learn more about the ongoing animal activity in the Park. Signs of animal activity can be found everywhere once you learn the art of looking.

To help you get more out of your outdoor experience, Paula Coughlin will lead a hike in the Park looking for tracks and sign of our resident animals. Paula is the Citizen Science Coordinator for the CT Audubon Society Center at Pomfret, and will share her extensive knowledge and teaching skills with the goal of helping us get more from each outdoor adventure in the woods or even the back yard.



The Park is home to a wide variety of woodland residents, such as raccoon, fisher, turkey, deer, beaver, short-tailed weasel, flying squirrel, great horned owl, white-footed mouse, and river otter, just to name a few. We hope to be finding sign of some of these animals on our Introduction to Animal Tracking hike. Snowshoes are recommended, and several pairs will be available from the Willington Recreation Commission.
