# Assessor



The Assessor's Office administers exemption programs which benefit the elderly, disabled, blind, and veterans.

**Elderly/Totally Disabled Tax Relief Program:** Completed applications are due biannually by May 15. Anyone applying after April 15 must apply by appointment. We will be happy to assist you in filing your application. Please call in advance for an appointment so we may provide the time and attention necessary 860-487-3122.

To be eligible for such a tax credit:

- You or your spouse must be at least 65 years of age as of Dec 31, 2020 or over 18 and permanently and totally disabled per Social Security.
- You must be a permanent resident of the State of Connecticut. You must own the property or hold a tenancy for life or for a term of years, which makes the applicable liable for payment of taxes (CGS Sec. 12-48) as of October 1, 2020. The property must be the applicant's primary residence (domicile).
- Your 2020 income cannot exceed \$37,600(single) or \$45,800(married) Income definition: Qualifying income is defined as adjusted gross income for IRS purposes plus any other income not included in such adjusted gross income.

You must provide the Assessor with a copy of your SSA 1099 for 2020, or its equivalent, from Social Security and your 2020 federal income tax return if you file one. The Assessor may require any other proof of income that may be necessary for the certification of the claim, such as interest/dividend statements and pension statements.

**Disabled:** Any individual who receives a disability pension from the Social Security Administration and has been designated by the SSA is eligible for a \$1000 exemption off your assessment. To qualify you must file proof of 100% disability from Social Security (form TPQY) or a copy of your "Award Letter" that states disability. This application only needs to be filed once. Filing Deadline: October 1

**Blind:** Any individual that presents a Certification of Legal Blindness from the Board of Education and Services for the Blind, BESB that states he/she is considered to be legally blind may be eligible for a \$3,000 exemption off your assessment. Filing Deadline: October 1

**Veterans:** If you are a veteran of any war period so declared in the Connecticut General Statutes, you may be entitled to an exemption. An original or certified copy of his/her honorable discharge (DD-214) must be filed in the Willington Land Records prior to October 1. Filing Deadline: September 30

**Additional Veteran's Exemption:** Veterans who maintain a disability rating from the VA of at least 10% are entitled to an increased exemption. Depending on the disability rating and income level. Filing deadline: October 1

Applications can be obtained at the Assessor's Office and can be sent to you by mail or e-mail if you call 860487-6122 during office hours, Monday 12:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. and Tuesday - Friday 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

## Conservation Commission

### REQUEST FOR HELP!

To all who use, enjoy, and appreciate the trails and woodlands in the Fenton/Ruby/Drobney and Talmadge/Knowlton preserves:



*The Willington Conservation Commission needs your help! If you would be willing to give us a hand in whatever capacity, small or large, to help keep these assets safe and user-friendly, it would be greatly appreciated. Volunteer commission members maintain these resources by building and repairing bridges and boardwalks, paint-blazing the trails, clearing fallen trees from the trails, maintaining trail signs, pruning back brush from the trails, and picking up litter. If you would like to help us continue to provide citizens with the opportunity to enjoy and appreciate our natural environment, please see the contact information under "Opportunity" at the end of this article. Thank you!*

*Trail etiquette for the COVID 19 Pandemic: Please maintain appropriate social distancing at all times and in all areas of our parks and preserves. When on the trail, be prepared to step a safe distance off the trail to let other hikers pass. Have a mask available if you cannot maintain adequate distances. Thank you!*

**Spring!** is here and with it comes the opportunity to watch nature unfold from its winter hibernation. Put your walking shoes on, grab your binoculars and camera (and take the usual tick-deterrent precautions!) and go out and observe the wide variety of wildlife and plants as they bring new life to the forests, wetlands, fields, ponds and waterways in Willington's extensive nature preserves.



The 300-acre Fenton-Ruby Park and Wildlife Preserve and Drobney Sanctuary on Moose Meadow Road has 4-plus miles of trails through woods, over ridges, and along ponds and streams. A kiosk with maps is located at the parking area, and a box with nature trail guides is located a short distance down the Taylor Trail. Several picnic tables and benches are available in the picnic area adjacent to the parking lot and overlooking the beaver pond.

**Suggestions:** (1) Take the Ruby Trail and the Ashford Link Trail over to Ashford's Langhammer Preserve; (2) Observe wildlife from the viewing/fishing deck at the beaver pond; (3) Walk leisurely and partake of the benefits of shinrin-yoku and forest bathing; (4) Walk up Burma Road past the boulders near the Ruby Trail junction (Note: This is not a maintained trail, there may be some rough sections.) and take a right onto Amidon Road (a dirt, woods road) and look for the fairy houses at the base of trees.

**Please abide by Park regulations to help make visiting an enjoyable experience for everyone. The opportunity to observe wildlife in this sanctuary will be greatly increased for all if pets are kept on leashes. Wildlife will adapt to the presence of people, not so much to pets.**

The 28-acre Talmadge Tract, containing the Talmadge Spur Trail will take you through scenic woodlands and along gravel Mason Road. On the other side of Mason Road is the 138-acre Royal Knowlton Preserve. Several miles of the Connecticut Blue Trail (Nipmuck) run through this area, with a portion along the Fenton River as it flows through a deep ravine. The 3/4-mile Knowlton Spur Trail connects the Nipmuck Trail to the Talmadge Trail. Maps can usually be found at the sign at the Talmadge/Knowlton trailheads on Mason Road where there is now a parking area, and also at the sign where the Nipmuck crosses Mason Rd. Brochures and trail maps for both these areas can also be found at the Town Clerk's office and the library, and the same information is available for Fenton-Ruby on the Conservation Commission website (see below).



# Conservation Commission Continued...

**Other hikes:** (1) An interesting and scenic place for a short hike is along Roaring Brook. A trail and fishing area along this rock-strewn river bed with its rapids and pools bordered by large oaks and pines can be accessed from a parking area on the right a quarter-mile up Village Hill Road from Rte 32. NB: There is no maintained trail here and there is one steep climb. Stairs lead down from the lot to a path under the bridge. Care is needed on wet rocks and especially in high water. Although this is private property and should be respected as such, access is allowed by conservation easement. The easement property connects to a CT DEEP trout management area along the brook to Rte 32. (2) See also the information about Joshua's Trust's **Chenes Roches Preserve** under Parks and Recreation.

**Wanted:** We are looking for old aluminum extension ladder sections to which decking can be attached for use as trail bridges. Contact info below.

**Opportunity:** If you are interested in taking an active part in helping the Town manage its environmental resources, the Commission has openings for alternate members. Alternate members can actively participate in meetings and may be seated as voting members in the absence of regular members. Anyone is welcome to attend our meetings in the lower level of the Town Office Building on the third Wednesday of every month. (Under COVID protocols, meetings are held by Zoom. See the Town website for the link in the agenda.) ### GARDINER HALL JR HISTORY MUSEUM

2014 was a very good year...

The Gardiner Hall Jr History Museum was established in 2014 by a passionate group of dedicated individuals and Board members of the “Friends of The Mill Works”. As the original home of the Gardiner Hall Jr Company, The Mill Works facility was listed on the CT State Register of Historic places this same year.



In 2014, the Friends of The Mill Works also wrote a grant application on behalf of the Town of Willington that considered the historic significance and revitalization of the “Village” of South Willington. The grant, entitled “Vibrant Communities Initiative” (VCI), represented a \$50,000 consultancy grant administered by the CT Trust for Historic Preservation (now Preservation CT). We were one of five (5) towns in the state to be awarded the grant. The final report generated from this grant can be viewed at [www.ec-chap.org/vci](http://www.ec-chap.org/vci). Though to date the implementation of recommendations from the report are limited, an outcome from this process was the identification of the *South Willington National Historic District* in 2017.




## EC-CHAP Continued...

In 2016, the transition from the Friends of The Mill Works to the Eastern Connecticut Center for History, Art, and Performance (EC-CHAP) brought about a new vision for the museum. The GHJ History Museum was expanded and relocated to its current location at The Mill Works.

The Gardiner Hall Jr History Museum reopened to the public in September 2020, with new artifacts on display. The museum continues its mission to raise awareness of local and regional history and preservation of assets. Our focus is the period from the mid 19<sup>th</sup> Century to present. The Gardiner Hall Jr History Museum is also open Saturdays from 10:00am to 2:00pm. COVID-19 Guidelines apply.

### Art Article

#### TITLE: "Acrylic Pour Art is for Everyone"

Acrylic Pouring is a fantastic art form that involves mixing and pouring acrylic paints strategically in order to make organic looking paintings.



This process, while appearing relatively simple, is deceptively complex. Taking a look at Acrylics origins, we can see how it may have evolved into what we know

today as pour art.

With the discovery of Acrylic Resins as a binding agent in 1915, Acrylic paint became a popular art form around the 1950s, with 1955 producing the first widely and commercially available acrylics. With this, new movements such as Pop Art and Abstract Expressionism began to take hold. Acrylics proved to be a fun new medium to work with as opposed to oil paints, as they dry quickly and allow for bold layering and lines. They were a popular choice with artists such as Andy Warhol, Robert Motherwell, Larry Poons, and Helen Frankenthaler just to name a few.

The flexibility of this new medium has since evolved into many forms since its introduction, and subsequent popularity in the 20th Century and onward. Today, acrylics are used in a variety of different art styles, including Modernism, Abstract Art, and Photo Realism.

Since its inception, Acrylic Pour art has taken off with artists and non artists alike. The process is simple enough: put paint in a cup, pour the cup over a canvas or panel and boom! Art!

This however can be made more complex with the inclusion of stabilizers and silicones. In order to have the correct consistency for pouring your acrylics, often stabilizers are used to thin out the paint in a way that won't weaken its integrity.

They can be anything from commercial paint flow additives, to a mixture of Elmer's glue and water! Silicone can be added in small amounts to increase the chances of "Cells" being created.



Cells are often sought after in acrylic pour art. They are pockets of layered paint that split apart on the canvas, leaving an organic cell like shape behind. Silicones act as a barrier between the layers of paint, and will help encourage the layering and splitting effect.

These processes can get additionally more complex with new techniques being created. Some people work with a spinning canvas, others with a strainer to pour their paint through, others prefer the simple "Dirty Pour" with paint in a cup. Each technique produces fantastic organic looking paintings that are colorful and eye catching.

The best part of this art form is that anyone can do it! If you would like to create something both fun and beautiful, I highly recommend this technique. While messy, it is incredibly satisfying and can make some truly unforgettable art.



Did you know that Willington has a Commission to further its economic development? The Willington Economic Development Commission (EDC) is a member-appointed group that promotes economic welfare, employment opportunities, and greater quality of life for the residents of the Town of Willington. The EDC supports businesses as they approach compliance with local, state and federal rules. EDC creates a community for business owners to bolster growth, and provides opportunities for collaboration. The EDC meets monthly and welcomes business owners to attend and participate.

Over the next few months, Willington residents will see some exciting changes coming to the 32,754 square feet Willington Crossing, formerly known as Phelps Plaza. Longtime residents of the town might remember the excitement of the new plaza when it was built in 1989. Current investment from developers in 2020 is anticipated to bring a resurgence of interest in the area for business traffic. The Planning and Zoning Commission approved new signage to define the area as open to development and to draw attention to the vacant units, which are available for mixed use. The new signage has 'Willington Crossing' in bold letters that stand out on the ribbon banner and an attractive train illustration, highlighting the historical significance of the area as a commerce hub. The top billed spot is Lots & More, who will be moving into the largest unit in early summer 2021. The signage has markers for the individual businesses which are intended to increase awareness and drive traffic to the plaza, as well as pique interest in the plaza, which is rated in the top 50% of Moody's Analytics Commercial Location Score.



### Open Burning

Now that the winter is almost passed, our attention will go toward picking up fallen branches, and trees in our yards. What to do with these unwanted trees/branches. Well, first you can load them onto your trailer or truck and bring them to the Land Fill. There is a place beyond the shipping containers that the workers can direct you to unload those items. Another action would be, piling the brush in an area not located near out buildings or in the woods, and calling for an Open Burning permit. This permit is free, and is requirement to burn. Normally the permits are good for about four(4) weeks, this will allow you to schedule your time to complete your clean up. On the Town's web site under Open Burning Official is the guide lines on what to burn and the time your allotted each day.

Please follow those guide lines. If you fail to receive a permit and the Fire Department is called to an unauthorized burning, you may receive a citation.

Takes only a few minutes to obtain a permit, it's completed over the phone, and it's free.

## Historical Society

Swim instructors must be at least 18 years or older and required to be WSI (Water Safety Instructor) certified, Lifeguard Certified, CPR and First Aid Certified. All applicants are also required to teach multiple level classes with a minimum of eight children per class. The swim instructor must be willing to communicate with parents as well as the participants and be able to accommodate all aspects and levels of the program.

Seasonal Lifeguards must be at least 16 years or older and must be Lifeguard Certified, CPR and First Aid Certified. Lifeguards will monitor activities in swimming areas to prevent accidents, provide assistance to swimmers, caution swimmers of usage areas, rescues swimmers in danger of drowning and administer First Aid/CPR when needed, maintain order in swimming areas at all times, inspect facilities for any dangers and reports them to the appropriate personnel. Lifeguards principle duties are to ensure the safety and well-being of the patrons and to observe and enforce all rules and regulations of the pond. Dates of employment are June 19 - August 22, 2021.

## Science Corner with Emily



Octopuses are the most neurologically complex invertebrates on Earth with a vastly different fundamental makeup compared to vertebrates. At a glance they are incredibly vulnerable with such soft bodies and eight long tentacles. It is a wonder how they have survived this long. Having studied and observed their behavior for decades there is a clear answer to that question. They are masters of camouflage and trickery, outsmarting everything around them.

Their soft bodies give them the advantage of being able to squeeze between impossibly small nooks and crannies along the ocean floor. They have been observed building dens and even using rocks to create doors. Their eight long arms lined with hundreds of suckers move independently due to a complex bundle of neurons, acting as a brain allowing them to smell, touch and manipulate objects. The photo below is showing one of the many ways an octopus can hide in plain sight. Using these suckers to quickly grab scattered shells on the sea floor and wrapping itself into a tight ball until an unfortunate fish swims too close.

The skills of an octopus are far from over. Octopus belong to an exclusive group called Cephalopods, one of this groups unique abilities is to change colors based on surroundings. Octopuses, squid and cuttlefish all makeup this group and have a specialized cell in their skin called chromatophores. These cells have a stretchy sac filled with red, yellow, brown or black pigment. When muscles around the cell tighten the pigment sac becomes wider making it more visible on the octopus' skin. Unlike other animals in the kingdom that have chromatophores, cephalopod's cells are individually attached to a nerve, meaning the expansion and contraction is controlled by the nervous system. Their brain signals the color response when predator or prey are observed. They can not only change their skin color but texture as well. Manipulating their skin to appear as barnacles or coral on a rock. Taking it a step farther, the mimic octopus is known for contorting its body to appear as a sea snake or flatfish.



Octopuses have great escape tactics as well; they can shoot themselves forward quickly away from prey by expelling water from a muscular tube called a siphon. They can also release a cloud of black ink, obscuring a predator's visual field and sense of smell. Allowing the octopus to make a fast dash for cover. Even if caught, the octopus can sacrifice an arm to a predator and still survive. Possessing the ability to regenerate the limb over a short time period.

In captivity they have been observed dismantling filtration systems, squirting water at people and shooting water out of the tank to cause a commotion. New research has been published arguing octopuses not only feel physical pain but emotional pain and pleasure as well. This emotional side of them is beautifully highlighted in the documentary "My Octopus Teacher". In a kelp forest off the coast of South Africa, a filmmaker highlights the life of a common octopus and follows her for almost a year. The two form a deep connection and she shows him her world; how she sleeps, lives and eats. If you are looking for something to watch on Netflix this weekend, I highly recommend this documentary. It will certainly leave you with a newfound love for the octopus!



# Tax Collector

## TAX OFFICE

Greetings Willington Residents:

Due to COVID-19, the Town Office Building is still closed to the public until further notice.

We are still strongly encouraging everyone to make payments by mail, by use of our drop box located outside the front entrance or online at [www.willingtonct.org](http://www.willingtonct.org). Please note that there is a convenience fee of 2.95% for credit cards and \$1.95 for EFT for online payments.

If you need to make your payment in person, this will be done by appointment only. Please call the Revenue Department at (860)487-3111 to set up a time to come in.

As a reminder, tax bills will be mailed out in June. These bills will be due July 1st, and may be paid without penalty until August 2, 2021. If you do not receive a bill, please contact our office at 860-487-3111 or email me at [collector@willingtonct.org](mailto:collector@willingtonct.org).

Please note, that per §12-130 "**Failure to send out or receive any such bill or statement shall not invalidate the tax.**" Or in simpler terms, failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the tax payer of his/her responsibility for the payment of taxes or delinquent charges. So please make sure to reach out to our office if you do not receive an expected bill.

### **What am I being Taxed on?**

You are being taxed on Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicles as of October 1, 2020.

Real Estate – All real property listed on the Grand List.

Personal Property – In the most general terms, personal property is everything subject to ownership, excluding land, any interest in land or any permanent improvement thereon. It is property that is not permanently affixed to or part of real estate. By its very nature then, personal property is moveable. This broad definition includes tangible items such as airplanes, campers, unregistered vehicles, items for business as furniture, fixtures, equipment, and animals.

Registered Motor Vehicles – Vehicles listed with the Department of Motor Vehicles are coded by tax town, and the Assessor is provided a list of registered vehicles annually. Willington's Town Code is 160.

All tax bills are mailed directly to property owners unless the Tax Collector receives specific instructions to send the bill to your bank or financial institution.

Real Estate and Personal Property tax totaling \$100 or more are due in two installments; July and January. Motor vehicle tax is due in one installment in July. Please note, we do not send out bills for the second installment in January. There is a stub on the July bills for the January payment.

### **How can I pay my bill?**

The Revenue Office accepts cash, money orders or personal checks for payment at the office. If our office is closed, you can leave a check in our Drop Box outside the front door of the building. You may also pay on line at [www.willingtonct.org](http://www.willingtonct.org) and click on the button that says "**OnLine Tax Payments**". There is a convenience fee of 2.95% for credit cards or \$1.95 for EFT. You can also call 844-859-7566 to pay by phone, but an additional fee of 75 cents will be added. We do have a public access computer at Town Hall which will allow you to make a credit card payment on line.

# Town Parks & Amenities



## Fenton-Ruby Park and Wildlife Preserve:

Moose Meadow Road and Burma Road; hiking/walking trails, bird watching, fishing, non-motorized boating, cross country skiing, snow shoeing and picnic area.

## Knowlton Property:

Mason Road – Hiking Trails

Willington's Public Works Department constructed a parking lot for hiking trail access on Mason Road. This lot will allow safe parking for access to the Talmadge Spur Trail and the Knowlton Spur Trail. Both trails connect to the Nipmuck Trail, part of the Connecticut Blue Trail System.

## Talmadge Tract:

Mason Road – Hiking Trails (adjacent to the Knowlton Property)

## Chenes Roches Preserve:

Chenes Roches (transl. oaks rocks) is a 56-acre wooded preserve in northeast Willington and owned by Joshua's Tract Conservation and Historic Trust. Trails wind through a varied terrain of hardwood forests, stands of pines and along a hemlock-shaded stream in a steep-sided valley. A round trip of 1.8 miles will take you across several small spring-fed streams and an altitude change of about 250 feet from the parking lot to the valley stream. A trail map and additional information about the preserve, including directions, can be found on the Joshua's Trust website, [joshuustrust.org](http://joshuustrust.org). There is a kiosk with trail maps at the small parking area 500 feet past the south end of Laurel Drive.

**Please stay on the trail and respect boundaries where the trail passes near private property.**

Note: The parking area is not plowed in the winter and parking on the road is not advisable.

## Kevin Legare Memorial Fields - 40 Old Farms Road:

Baseball and Softball fields

## The Park on Village Hill Road:

Overlooking the Roaring Brook, a popular fishing spot during fishing season.

## River Road Athletic Complex - 511 River Road:

Randy Lerner Memorial Baseball Field, basketball court, pavilion, playscape, swings, multi-sport field, volleyball sand court, walking path (one lap = .33 miles) and outdoor fitness equipment. No golfing allowed.

**Dogs are welcome but must be leashed and cleaned up after.** Doggie poo bags are available.

Complex is **CARRY IN-CARRY OUT**. Dogs are not allowed on the baseball field. \*\*State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.



## Willington School Building Committee

### Willington School Building Committee Katherine Viveiros, Chairman

The Willington School Building Committee has started meeting to discuss the future of our school buildings.

Over approximately 7 years, the Willington Board of Education (BOE) spent a significant amount of time identifying avenues to address the future of the school facilities. After exhaustive [data collection](#), public presentations and public input, the BOE made a unanimous recommendation in September, 2019 requesting the Board of Selectmen establish a School Building Committee (SBC) to pursue the building of a preschool through 8 school. A Special Town Meeting was held on January 30, 2020 where residents approved the formation of a School Building Committee.

The Selectmen appointed eleven members to the [School Building Committee](#) from a diverse background in construction, project management, education, and finance. The charge of the committee is to define a preschool through grade 8 school to meet Willington's educational needs. The formation of a School Building Committee does not mean the town is building a new school. Defining the town's school facility needs may result in the committee recommending renovating one of the schools to make one preschool through grade 8 building, building a new preschool through grade 8 building, or maintaining our two schools.

The SBC will be holding [regular meetings](#) via Zoom on the first and third Wednesday of each month and [agendas](#) and [minutes](#) can be found on the town website. We encourage our townspeople to [subscribe to e-Alerts](#) found on the front page of the town website to receive notifications of meetings. Meetings are being recorded and can be accessed via the town's [YouTube page](#). The SBC will be posting information on the Town website in the near future.
